

## Prohibited equipment

If electrical products or unlicensed radio products are likely to cause widespread or severe interference to radio reception, a notice prohibiting the installation, use, sale, distribution or manufacture of such products can be gazetted by the Chief Executive under regulation 32(1) of the [Radiocommunications Regulations 2001](#).

Further, if the matter is sufficiently serious the supplier may be required, pursuant to a notice under regulation 36, to recall any product sold and refund the price paid for the product.

Any breach of the following notices is an offence:

Other notices may be gazetted whenever significant risk to the radio spectrum from particular interfering equipment is identified.
